




TRANSPORTATION

The school provides transport facilities.

- 4. The school vans are equipped with speed governors, GPS and CCTVs.

Mess Facility can be availed on payment. Mess Facility however is compulsory for students of UKG and 1st Std.

- 3. The school is set amidst natural surroundings.
- 4. The school has a well-equipped library with informative books, journals and magazines.
- 5. Mass Drill for students is organized regularly.
- 6. The school has a house system to group the staff and students into four houses viz., Emerald, Pearl, Ruby and Sapphire.
- 7. The school has a prefectorial body with the school captain, sports captain, vice captains and cultural secretaries.
- 8. The school believes in instilling sound moral values in the young minds to build up a good society. The subjects Moral Instruction and General Knowledge aim at teaching children discipline, character and Indian traditions and culture.
- 9. The school has special prayer sessions on Fridays. To inculcate the spirit of brotherhood they chant prayers from all faiths.
- 10. Regular open house sessions are held wherein the parents/guardians meet the teachers to discuss the progress of their wards.
- 11. The annual magazine brought out at the end of the academic term acts as a link between the school and the parents/students. The contents will highlight the various happenings / programmes / activities at school, besides showcasing the talents of CVians.
- 12. Season of sharing is organised to instil in young minds an awareness about the needs of the less fortunate.

- 13. Summer classes are regularly organized in dance, music (vocal), drawing and painting, Tanjore painting, chess, cricket, basketball, volleyball, yoga and computer science. Additional courses may be offered, subject to operational enrollment.
- 14. The school encourages students to be a part of the glorious School Band.
- 15. School provides good care to health and hygiene with the kind courtesy of the Apollo Hospitals.
- 16. To promptly update parents on all school activities, the management sends messages through email and Whatsapp. Parents can access this free website: chettinad vidyashram.org/parent login
- 17. Digital learning through smart boards is a prestigious venture adopted by Chettinad Vidyashram for Standard I-IV. It empowers students with well researched, mapped-to-curriculum digital modules which are projected right away in the classrooms to elucidate and explain concepts. Teaching has become more creative and interesting with the installation of the software 'STEM'.
- 18. International trips are organized for students to widen their perception of various global aspects.
- 19. Legal Studies has been offered as an Elective for Humanities /Commerce Stream. Legal Symposium is conducted to help students comprehend law and its intricacies
- 20. Department of Psychology conducts an inter school fest 'Pragya' to encourage a better insight into the subject.
- 21. The debate club Ampersand holds inter-school debate competitions every year.
- 22. Sangam, a Political Science Club is a platform to bring together students to debate, discuss and disseminate opinion on national and international political issues. The MUN Club trains students to participate in MUNs in the city. A youth parliament showcasing parliamentary procedures is organised yearly. A newsletter is also published featuring current affairs, views and articles written by the students.

EVER WIDENING HORIZON

AV Room: The school has well-equipped AV Rooms with excellent acoustics. The school curriculum is presented through visual media. Computer Lab: The School computer labs are the cutting edge of new technology. High speed Internet facility is available for carrying out programs and projects of the curriculum. Sincere efforts are taken to give hands-on experience to each student. Lessons through multimedia sessions are available for classes I-V.

Math Lab: To make Math learning an enjoyable experience, the school has a meticulously designed Math Lab. Children are given practical insight by using "Play-Way" method.













English Lab: English language lab is an asset to the school. The air-conditioned labs provided with latest equipment aim at enhancing a child's comprehension and listening skills in English. They are taught phonetics to understand the intricacies of sound, thereby giving a finesse to their communication skills.
